

On March 13, 2020, in compliance with federal, state and county regulations associated with the COVID-19 pandemic, the DeKalb Entertainment Commission cancelled or postponed all film permits as well as declined all subsequent requests for film permits. As a result of CEO Thurmond's most recent executive order on April 24, 2020, which provided a 30-day transition plan to reopen DeKalb County, the DeKalb Entertainment office will resume the issuance of film permits on June 1<sup>st</sup> with the following safety guidelines:

All applicants requesting to film in DeKalb County, Georgia will be required to provide a copy of a safety plan detailing all the precautions the production will take to prevent the spread of infections due to the coronavirus.
